2026 Application Process

- 1) A completed RIFTA application and Money Order, Dept. Check or P.O. Number must be received by May 20, 2026.
 - a. Applications will NOT BE ACCEPTED without payment or dept. PO#. Generous donations by the RIAFC Foundation & RISFFL Foundation will be applied towards the fee for R.I. students. All out of state students will need to pay the whole fee.
- 2) Payment: RI - \$ 50, or \$150 out of state, must be made to: **RI Fire Instructors' Association** (NOT Fire Academy or State of RI)

- 4) You will be notified by email from the RIFA of which class selection you have received on or before May 24, 2026.
- 5) **REMEMBER - There is no longer an endorser, as there is no longer a separate NFA application.** The RIFTA application has been revised to capture all the data the NFA requires. RIFTA will send the application information to the NFA after the sign-up period is closed. The NFA will send you a confirmation email once they receive the information.

Prerequisite for on-campus classes

All students must complete Incident Command System ICS-100 and ICS-200 levels (on-line training) before arriving for on-campus class. If you have completed them ON-LINE previously, you don't have to do it again.



Two-Day Course Descriptions

W0256 Safety for Hazardous Materials Incidents (HM:SHMI)

Using scenarios and activities, you will oversee the safety officer role in preparing for, responding to, and recovering from hazardous materials/WMD incidents.

W0296 Incident Management and Leadership Fundamentals for the Company Officer (IM:LFCO)

Company officers (or those aspiring to be) will learn practical information including preplanning, managing incidents, operational communications, safety and other critical aspects of the job.

W0457 Decision Making for Company Operations (DMICO)

Training for company officers to master vital decision-making skills at structure fires to accomplish assigned tactics, positively impact all aspects of the incident and produce a favorable outcome.

W0520 Executive Skills Series: Exercising Leadership within Communities (ESS: ELC)

Gain an understanding of a variety of ideas, peoples and cultures and the skills for effective leadership when confronting adaptive challenges presented by diverse internal and external communities.

W0609 Introduction to Unified Command for All-Hazard Incidents (UC:AHI)

Company officers can gain a better understanding of multiagency needs and a unified command structure, resulting in the knowledge and skills necessary to operate effectively in complex incidents.

W0647 Leadership in Supervision: Perspectives in Thinking (LIS: PIT)

Company officers can gain a better understanding of multiagency needs and a unified command structure, resulting in the knowledge and skills necessary to operate effectively in complex incidents.

W0756 Fire Investigations: Fire As A Weapon (FI: FAW)

This course was developed to aid first responders in understanding and recognizing how fire can be used as a weapon against people and/or property. This course should also help first responders and investigators understand why a person would choose to use fire as a weapon, as well as creating awareness of the types of information fire investigators may need from fire and emergency services personnel.

W0762 New Fire Chief: Contemporary Issues (NFC: CI)

This two-day course will develop managerial skills, leadership skills, and contemporary issues and awareness necessary for newly appointed or elected fire chiefs to effectively meet their obligations. It helps to develop knowledge, skills, and attitudes necessary to perform effectively now and in the future. Primary Audience: Newly appointed or elected fire chiefs in volunteer, combination or career departments.

Travel Arrangements

You must make your own travel arrangements for the trip. Driving time is typically 8 hours from Rhode Island. Air travel can be arranged to either Reagan National Airport or Baltimore-Washington International Airport. You will be responsible for providing your own transportation to NFA if you wish to fly. GPS: Enter "16825 South Seton Avenue, Emmitsburg, MD"

Transportation costs are the responsibility of the student or his/her organization and will not be reimbursed by the National Fire Academy or the Rhode Island Fire Instructors Association. ***Please arrive on Friday no later than 6 p.m. to check into the dormitory and attend the 7 p.m. orientation session.***

You must show a REAL ID valid photo identification (or passport) to enter the campus. *Firearms are strictly forbidden, along with knives longer than 3", machetes, bow & arrows, ammunition, rifles, shotguns, and pistols. Also, alcohol is not allowed on campus and will be confiscated, other than purchased alcoholic beverages in the Command Post Pub.*

NFA No-Show Policy
